This means that it is not regulated by the Charity Commission and is exempt from registering or submitting annual returns. It also means that it does not have a Registered Charity Number of its own [vide the Charities Act 2006]. Objectives ▪ <i>To maintain or to increase the efficiency of His Majesty's Army and particularly that of the Royal Military Police (RMP)</i>	Founded in 2022, the Trust arose from the legacy of former Provost Marshal (Army) Brigadier Brian Thomas CBE who wished its income be spent on the Royal Military Police (RMP) on scholarships & bursaries; expeditions; grants to the RMP Museum & Church, memorial commemorations & festivals; aid research for histories etc; & activities fostering cooperation between international Military Police forces. Objectives ▪ The Trust's object is the promotion of the efficiency of the Royal Military Police (to include both regular and reserve forces) and, in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, the promotion of esprit de corps and the preservation of the history, deeds and traditions of the Royal Military Police	Funding for the RMP Museum, which is an Unincorporated Charity, is derived from donations and investment income.
